

## New City Catechism

Question 18: Will God allow our disobedience and idolatry to go unpunished?

*Answer: No, God is righteously angry with our sins and will punish them both in this life, and in the life to come.*

Ephesians 5:5-6

**Parents Note:** Future questions will deal with the answer to this very serious problem. For now, please help your family to feel the weight and serious consequences of our sin.

“Til sin be bitter, Christ will not be sweet”–Thomas Watson.

When was the last time someone in the family said, “It’s not fair!”? Parents, share a time growing up when you felt you were treated unfairly.

The Bible often uses a similar word for “fair.” This word is “just.” If someone is just he or she could also be called fair.

Read Deuteronomy 32:3-4. What do we learn about God from this verse?

We have spent the last few weeks discussing the 10 Commandments and our disobedience when it comes to God’s Holy Commandments. We have learned...

- What sin is (missing God’s holy mark for our lives)
- What idolatry is (honoring or worshipping someone/thing above God)
- We are all guilty of such things – “For all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God” Romans 3:23

If God is fair and just, what must God do about that?

Read Ecclesiastes 12:14, Matthew 12:36-37, and Ephesians 5:5-6  
What do we learn from these verses?
